

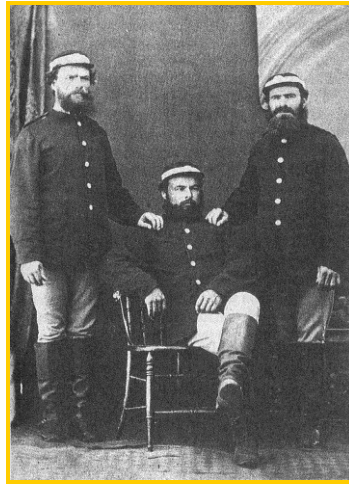
Police History

Soon after his arrival in the Swan River Colony, Captain Stirling envisaged the need to establish a civilian policing system. This would utilise part time constables appointed for local areas. In 1853 the W.A. Police Force was established.

As the Police Force evolved from that time, individuals of exceptional character, who were forced to adopt innovative measures to cope with harsh conditions, were needed. These early-day police officers can be said to be pioneers in the true sense of the word.

Western Australia is the largest policing jurisdiction in the world resulting in many unique situations requiring police officers to participate numerous significant events of historical importance.

For more than 150 years, police have been involved in diverse community activities, ranging from the care of the public, collecting agricultural statistics to solving horrendous crimes. Some of these activities have resulted in officers paying the ultimate price the loss of life.
